## WELCOME TO STDCONF’S DOCUMENTATION!

The following is a sample grammar.

### **productionlist**

This directive is used to enclose a group of productions. Each production is given on a single line and consists of a name, separated by a colon from the following definition. If the definition spans multiple lines, each continuation line must begin with a colon placed at the same column in the first line.

Blank lines are not allowed within `productionlist` directive arguments.

The following is an example taken from the Python Reference Manual.

```
try_stmt ::= try1_stmt | try2_stmt
try1_stmt ::= "try" ":" suite
              ("except" [expression ["," target]] ":" suite)+
              ["else" ":" suite]
              ["finally" ":" suite]
try2_stmt ::= "try" ":" suite
              "finally" ":" suite
```

This is plain text.
